About Innovation Unit Design Academy

The Innovation Unit Design Academy (IUDA) is an 8-month, project-based program, which supports organisations, leaders, and practitioners, to deliver real world innovation projects and grow their design capability for social impact and systems change.

Facilitated by our team of experienced Social Innovation Practitioners, the Design Academy runs as an online program with fortnightly workshops, regular coaching sessions, and peer-to-peer meetups, alongside a cohort of like-minded professionals and organisations.



Identify a project

Bring a team

We recommend 2 or 3 participants on a project to provide peer support and increase uptake of new ways of working*



Learn along the way

Over 8 months, complete the project with targeted learning and coaching



Create impact

Implement innovation, and secure long term shifts in mindsets and skills.

Intended outcomes

The Design Academy is intended to build design capability across the social sector in Australia, to help shift complex challenges and create better outcomes for people and communities.

For individuals

Building design capabilities to be applied in social innovation projects.

For organisations

Building innovation capacity, solving real-world problems, and developing leaders who think differently.

For the sector

Building the social sector's capacity to shift complex challenges and make the kind of impact Australia needs.



Program content

The Design Academy program will focus on developing knowledge and expertise design methodology as applied to complex social issues and systems change, as well as building wider design skills and creative confidence.



The IUDA journey

The program structure uses a parallel learning and project journey, coaching you through a real world project identified as a priority of your organisation.

Each phase is designed to help your team learn key design skills, from discovery through to implementation, and to apply these directly into practice.



Although we have some suggested milestones to guide your project work, our coaches and facilitators will work with you and your team to establish which deliverables will be most useful for your project. You will receive regular feedback on your project work through coaching sessions.



A month in the life

The monthly learning cycle of a Design Academy participant

WORKSHOP

Professionally facilitated online (2.5 hours)

Deep dives into design and innovation tools, skills, and approaches, led by experienced facilitators from the Innovation Unit team and expert guests.

MEETUP

Professionally facilitated online (~1.5 hours)

An opportunity to connect with the cohort and further explore specific concepts or tools.

COACHING*

Online with our Innovation Unit facilitators (1 hour)

Get bespoke advice and feedback as you develop your social innovation project. Teams each have 7 hours of coaching allocated across the program, and choose how to schedule their sessions.

WORKSHOP

Professionally facilitated online (2.5 hours)

Deep dives into design and innovation tools, skills and approaches as above, led by experienced facilitators from the Innovation Unit team and expert guests.


Matt BerrySenior Project Lead

How to join

Expressions of Interest (one per team)
By 6th Dec 2023

We encourage you to **identify a pair or trio** within your organisation (or with partners) who would be interested in **joining IUDA as a team** and work on a project together. Confirm your team's place By 15th Dec 2023 Once you've submitted your EOI, our team will have an informal chat with you to ensure IUDA is right for your team. You'll then be invited to pay a deposit to confirm your team's place in our 2024 cohort.

Submit participants' profile By 8th Jan 2024 Places will be confirmed, but we will also invite each of your team members to submit a participant profile so we can better understand participants' learning needs and strengths, and tailor the Design Academy to the cohort who'll be joining us.

Two-way interviews

From December 2023 to January 2024 We'll be in touch to line up a conversation with your team where we'll ask a bit more about what you're hoping to learn and the shape your project might take, and you can ask us any questions you might have about the program.

Onboarding and kick-off

Program commences early Feb 2024

After our interview you'll receive a welcome pack and we'll begin onboarding, including introducing you to the rest of the cohort, before we kick off the program early February 2024!
